A WORD FROM THE COUNCIL PRESIDENT

The two great buildings, taller than any house, crouch side by side in the middle of Rebersburg, where they have stood for 141 years. Another stands not far away, in the center of Madisonburg. We alance at them as we walk past – silent, serious looking, quite grand really - usually without paying them much notice because they are so familiar. The towns would not be complete without them, would not be Rebersburg, or Madisonburg. When we do notice them towering over us, it is with a deep and gentle affection; our eyes greet them as if they were people, as if they were greeting us back with a smile.

They will be missed some day, when old age catches up with them. They're so big that their absence itself will be gigantic. It will make an empty hole letting the cemetery stare up at the Main Streets. And when their absence speaks to us, it will be with a thousand memories, of faces young and getting older, old and no longer changing. Memories that remind us of each other at our best because that is what memories do, and what churches do to memories. They will leave us in no doubt that our three churches, two St. Peters on the corner, and Christ in the middle of the town, are not buildings, great and friendly as they are, but the people inside

them, alive and waggling like the fingers inside two backward-folded hands.

It seems there are fewer people every year wagging inside our church buildings. The thought worries us and gets pushed aside. But we are the church. We can't help making memories. Besides being where memories happen, we make them, shape them, plan for them. We do it all the time, greeting each other, kidding each other, helping each other, minding each other's dignity, loving each other.

Our church buildings remind us that the memories we make live longer than we do. We must be thoughtful how we make them.

GOD'S WORK, OUR HANDS

The whole charge is involved with a number of benevolences and mission projects this year! Among them:

Ladies' Aid Blankets St. Peter's Lutheran Church

St. Peter's Lutheran Church has a small group of ladies who have served the church in many ways over the years.

Our journey began in 2014 when we decided to begin a new service project to see where it would lead. In

December of 2014 we made 8 fleece blankets and gave them to Centre House, a home in State College who takes in the homeless. We had good feedback and great praise from the congregations of our charge so we decided we

would get the word out and see how we faired in raising money for our next batch of blankets. Last February we made another 13 blankets and gave them to the Centre County Woman's Resource Center. In September we made another 14 blankets and sent them to Hearts for the Homeless. This year we have been given enough money to double our efforts. We will be working on the blankets over the summer and into early fall so they will be ready for the cold season. CWS Emergency Buckets

God's work is indeed done by our hands. And this year this includes a goal to fill 12 Church Word Service Emergency Buckets. These buckets are full of the things that are needed when disaster strikes in the US, including floods, fire, earthquake, and tornados as well as hurricanes. The contents of the buckets are used by volunteers in stricken areas. You can find

items to purchase in all of the churches on colored slips of paper, and donations to fill the buckets are also accepted.

Food Pantry

Every Sunday we worship in St. Peter's UCC in Rebersburg is a day when we gather items for the Food Bank in Aaronsburg. Please consider bringing a canned good with you to church on Sunday and donating it!

Toiletries for Thrive DC

The homeless men and women who take showers at Thrive DC's Washington, DC facility, love having the small soaps, shampoos, and lotions that we might never use from our vacation or business travel hotel stays. If you need to travel, next time consider picking up those amenities, and donating them! There are baskets in each church for this purpose. Next delivery will be in mid-April.

GETTING MESSY!

The Rebersburg charge is searching for new ways to be church, that is to be a community of spiritual people. Our traditions highlight for us the truth that we don't have a lock on how God can be worshipped and adored, or how God interacts with all sorts of people. But we know from our experience that coming together in community is an important part of being followers of Jesus Christ.

So we have been exploring new ways to be church. In the last year we have heard about the Messy Church program, a creative, intergenerational



community of people who hear the bible story, respond to it creatively, and find time to worship. Messy Church seems to work better into the understanding and the timeframe of young families.

Messy Church sessions occur ONCE A MONTH, for two hours and involve a communal meal, creative and play sessions and time to celebrate community and God, and the divine in our lives.

Messy Church is NOT a new program, but in many ways a new church start, for young and old and all in between, who are pressed by the stresses of contemporary life and would like an evening of fun and celebration!

Messy Church will be held the fourth Wednesday of each month (except November when the fourth Wednesday is the day before Thanksgiving) from 6 to 8 PM. Food for those watching gluten, vegetarians, and other dietary restrictions included. Just let us know. Join us for food, creative fun and celebration!

God and fear and elections

Both our Hebrew and Christian scriptures remind us again and again that God is with us, and that God has enjoined us not to fear. For a recent sermon I went through my concordance and determined how many times I could find "Do not Fear" and "Be not Afraid" in the bible. I found 168. Others have claimed that the sentiment is in the bible far more than that. Indeed there is only one thing we are supposed to "fear" and that is God's own self. And the word used for that fear, in Hebrew, is closer to "experience awe and respect" than the kind of anxiety we associate with fear.

And yet we are in the midst of an election season where everyone seems to be marketing their candidate based on fear of the other. We're told that if the other person wins, life as we know it will end, and we will no longer be the blessed American people we are. But God has told us that God walks with us through everything. And that it will be OK.

Be sure to vote – voting is one important way that Christians care about each other. Vote with your own spiritual values in mind, including the teachings of Jesus Christ. Do that carefully and prayerfully! But do not let the fears and the loud rhetoric influence you. Use your heart and your mind, not your fear, to help you decide what to do in the voting box.

And if the other guy wins, don't assume the worst, and panic or give up. God will still be with us, and God will still walk with us. Do not fear. As the book of Proverbs says, *The fear of others lays a snare*, but one who trusts in the LORD is secure. Amen.
